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SCOTTSDALE, AZ – June 4, 2014 – In a recent letter to Secretary Sebelius, Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), the National Committee on Vital Health Statistics (NCVHS) recommended that HHS should name the NCPDP SCRIPT Standard Version 2013101 [Prior Authorization](#) transactions as the adopted standard for the exchange of prior authorization information between prescribers and processors for the pharmacy benefit. NCVHS also recommended that HHS should adopt the recommendation under the most appropriate regulatory sections and processes that would enable prompt industry implementation and at the earliest possible implementation time.

“The electronic prior authorization (ePA) transactions were developed using our proven, multi-stakeholder collaborative, consensus-building process,” explained Lee Ann Stember, president of NCPDP. “We are pleased to have NCVHS recommend adoption and prompt implementation of the ePA transactions in the NCPDP SCRIPT Standard. It provides an electronic means for exchanging the information required for a prior authorization, working within prescriber workflows, and it improves patient access to needed medications.”

NCPDP's SCRIPT Standard for ePrescribing was named in the Medicare Modernization Act (MMA) and is a requirement of Meaningful Use (MU).
